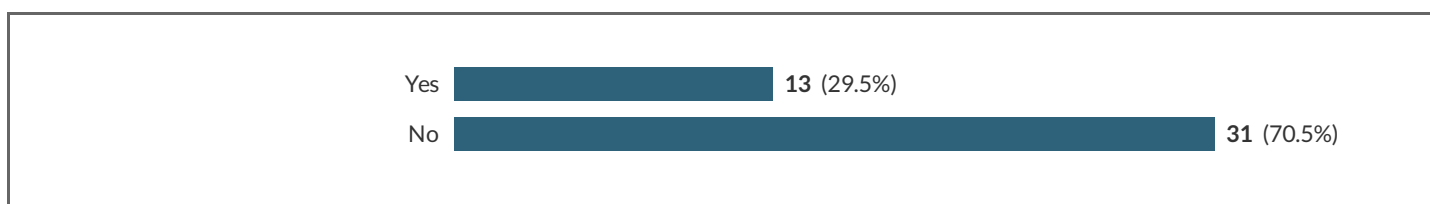

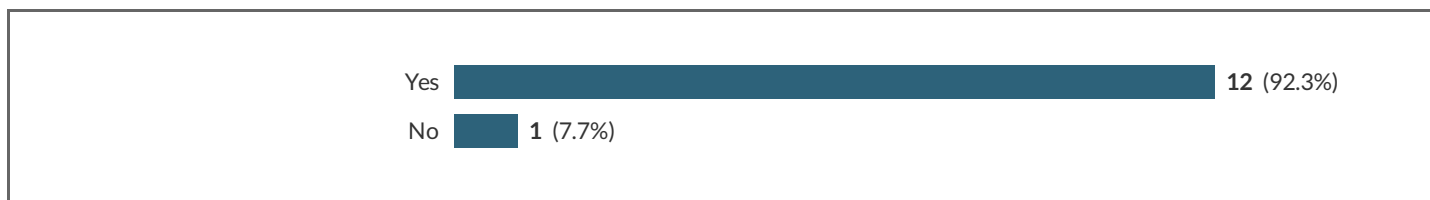

As module leader, emailing individual students who have failed to attend 2-3 weeks in a row offering support; I have had some success in re-engaging students using this approach	276923-276915-23522243

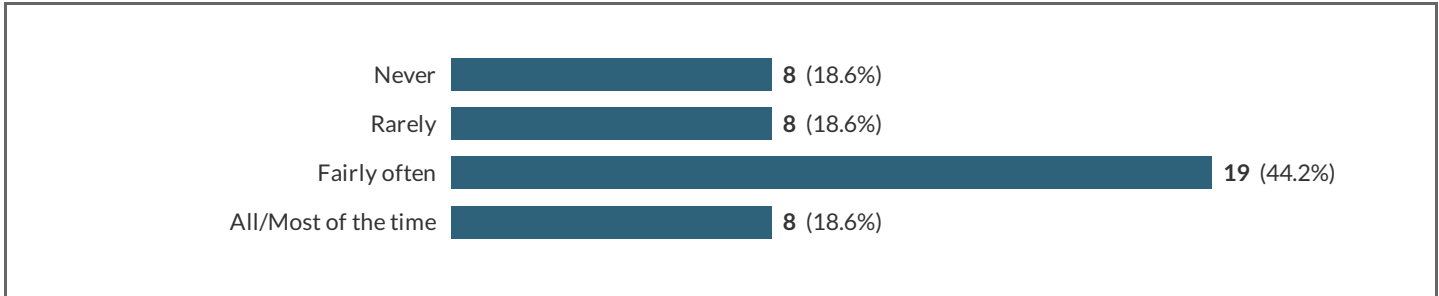

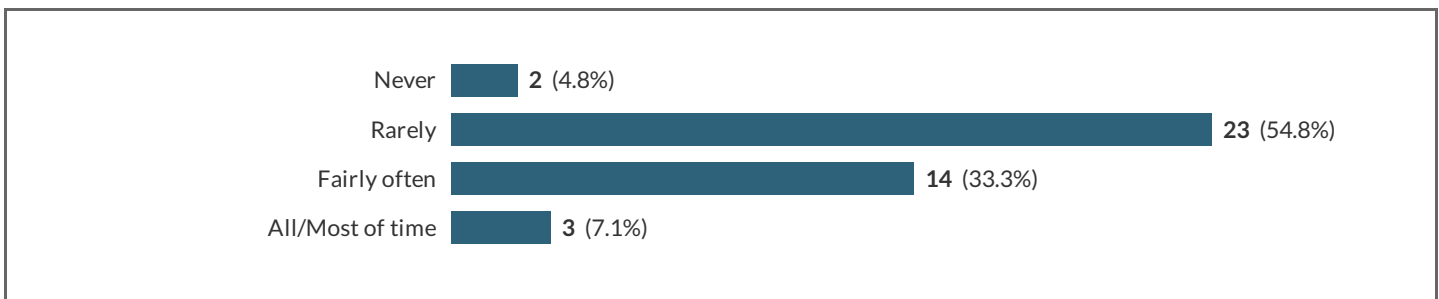
