This has a significant impact on retention and success. Hence, facilitating a collegiate student identity will support the university in its mission to improve satisfaction, enhance performance and provide a transformative learning experience. This enhancement network meeting will take the form of a workshop in which participants will explore how LJMU can encourage students to feel part of their university.
