**Shyness and the University**

#### **Abstract**

In this paper I will share some of the insights from my research on shyness, and from my recent book *Shrinking Violets*, and explore their implications for academic practice and teaching in higher education. How can shy lecturers thrive in an age of what Susan Cain calls 'the extrovert ideal' (*Quiet*, 2012, p. 17)? How can we help shy and socially anxious students? How do the communal spaces of the university, and the idea of the university as a community, help or hinder them? Are there even benefits to and special insights to be gained from shyness? Do we, for instance, value collaboration and group work too much at the expense of silence and solitary work? This will be an informal talk designed to stimulate discussion.


