- Science Teaching Annual Practice Exchange Series (STAPES) continues and moves to Week 7 to promote attendance. Provides an opportunity for critical discourse around teaching, learning and assessment, using topics prompted by Annual Teaching Observation and colleagues' contributions.

- Monthly meetings between Associate Dean (Education) and Directors.
- SCS Pedagogic Research Group continues with new chair, Becky Murphy.

New Activities for 2018/19

Faculty

- Online training video to be prepared for the WebPA peer-marking system for group work.
- Fund established to support staff attendance at pedagogic research conferences/events. £5K available.
- Revised transportation arrangements for the 20 Faculty Nexus pads for in-class survey completion, including PTES. Details to follow.
- MeeToo@2 event in Week zero: Drop-in at 2pm Mon-Fri. Emphasis on simple, retro-fittable techniques for using this system in exploring Science concepts.
- Walkabout week. Endorsed by FEC and pending approval by FMT. Colleagues indicate which of their teaching sessions in Week 6 is open to staff to drop in and observe. This is an informal process with no prescribed reporting or follow-up. Outcomes may inform discussion at STAPES in the following week.
